Role of our Council members

As a Council member you will have the opportunity to work with senior leaders and healthcare professionals to help the Society shape the future of intensive care. Council members are heavily involved in delivering our activities which sit broadly under five strategic priorities:

- Grow our membership by delivering quality products and services that support current and future members of the intensive care community.
- Influence the implementation of standards, guidelines, policies, quality improvement and research.
- Develop an expanded portfolio of quality blended learning activities and accreditation services.
- For SOA to be the leading Congress based on educational content, professional development opportunities and networking for all those involved in Critical Care.

The Society also has two critical enablers which are:

- Equality, Diversity and Inclusion
- Governance, financial resilience and environmental sustainability.

Roles and responsibilities

The successful candidate will enjoy building relationships with a broad spectrum of individuals and will play an integral role in developing the Society.

As an elected ICS Council member, you will automatically become a Company Member of the Society for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006 with some specific responsibilities as set out in our Articles of Association. This gives you opportunity in the future to stand for election as an Honorary Officer and become a Trustee of the Charity.

As a Council member you will:

- Collaborate with fellow intensive care professionals and the Society's management team to implement our five-year strategy
- To act as an ambassador for the Society and act in its best interests, as well as its beneficiaries at all times
- Use knowledge and experience to help advise the Trustee Board to reach robust decisions
- Prepare for and participate in Council and (where appropriate) relevant Committee meetings
- Promote the work of the Society externally to help enhance public confidence and trust
- Support the operations of the Society and its staff in helping to achieve the Council's strategic vision and the delivery of the charity's mission and objects

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- Work to our organisational values:
 - **Collaboration** – We work with others to maximise our impact
 - **Freedom of Expression** – We are bold in our actions and works and encourage diversity and views
 - **Accept and Respect** – We treat everyone with dignity and respect, and accept differences delivering our mission more effectively

Duration of role

Three-year term. Council members can serve a maximum of two terms (six years). Elected council members take up office at the Annual Members Meeting in December 2025.
