Person of the Year

Recognises a healthcare professional who has overcome personal or organisational difficulty to embody the Society's values or the values of their Trust.

Categories open are:

- Consultant of the Year
- Doctor in Training of the Year
- Specialty Doctor/SAS of the Year
- Nurse of the Year
- Pharmacist of the Year
- Physiotherapist of the Year
- Occupational Therapist of the Year
- Dietitian of the Year
- Speech and Language Therapist of the Year
- Advanced Critical Care Practitioner/Advanced Practitioner in Critical Care of
 the Year
- Other ICU clinician of the Year

Outstanding Leadership

Recognises an individual at any level who has shown outstanding leadership in an intensive care unit, hospital or organisation.

Going the Extra Mile

Recognises someone who is not a clinician and has gone above and beyond to support intensive care staff and patients in the past 12 months.



Intensive Care Organisational Awards

Team of the Year

Recognises a team within ICU who have navigated a problem or pressure to provide outstanding patient care.

Association of the Year

Recognises an association or organisation who provided outstanding support to intensive care staff.

Unit of the Year

Recognises an intensive care unit who have navigated a problem or pressure to provide outstanding patient care.

EDI Project of the Year

Recognises an individual, unit, hospital, Trust or organisation who have implemented a meaningful programme of change to further a culture of inclusivity in the workplace.

Towards Net Zero

Recognises a unit or team who have implemented a meaningful initiative aimed at improving planetary health and moving intensive care towards net zero.

Collaboration Project of the Year

Recognises a unit, hospital, or organisation who embarked on a collaborative project at a regional, national or international level to improve the experience of intensive care staff or patients.

Team Support

Recognises an individual, team or unit, who have developed a programme or other tools to support their intensive care staff.



Intensive Care Education Awards

Best New Education Programme

Recognises an organisation, unit, or hospital who have developed a new educational programme for intensive care staff.

Best Professional Development Support

Recognises an organisation, unit, or hospital who have developed resources or networks to assist ICU staff of any profession with their career development.

Best Educational Event on a Small Budget

Recognises an organisation, unit, or hospital who have organised an educational event for ICU staff utilising a small budget.

Future of Intensive Care Awards

Research

Recognises a research team whose work has had a major impact on critical care service provision.

Most Innovative Industry Partner

Recognises an organisation whose research or product development has made important changes to the provision of care to ICU patients.

Retention Campaign

Recognises a unit or hospital who have a run a successful campaign to retain intensive care staff.



Supporters of Intensive Care Awards

Best Patient Resources

Recognises an individual or organisation who have developed informational resources for ICU patients and/or their loved ones.

Advocacy

Recognises an individual or group, not working in healthcare, who have contributed their time and energy to publicly advocating for intensive care patients and staff.

Volunteer

An individual or group who have volunteered their time to improve the experience of intensive care patients.
