- Shape the Society's voice in national healthcare policy by producing timely consultation responses and position statements, for example in response to <u>the covid-inquiry</u>.
- Develop and implement systems for assessing and prioritising new standards and guideline proposals in consultation with the intensive care community.
- Oversee the delivery of up to four new or updated ICS guidelines annually and lead the review of existing guidance.
- Lead ICS involvement in the James Lind Alliance Priority Setting Partnership with the support of the Research Project Manager.
- Oversee the timely and impactful publication of the Journal of the Intensive Care Society working with the Editor and publisher with the support of the Research and Policy Manager.
- Represent the Society in key external forums including with NICE, DHSC, NIHR and professional bodies.
- Oversee the effective planning and delivery of Council and Trustee Board meetings.
- Support the Governance Coordinator in overseeing the governance of the Society and maintaining compliance with internal and charity governance requirements.
- Provide oversight for all policy research, priority setting, and engagement activities.
- Build trusted partnerships across the critical care community to co-produce and disseminate impactful work.
- Support the Society's strategic planning.
- Play a role in the Society's annual State of the Art (SOA) Congress.
- Manage the policy and standards budget and ensure any relevant income targets are met.
- Provide line management to a small team of four direct reports.
