Role of our PAG members

As a PAG member you will have the opportunity to work with colleagues in your profession to discuss issues of importance and ensure the profession is represented at Council.

Roles and responsibilities

The successful candidate will enjoy building relationships with a broad spectrum of individuals and will play an integral role in developing the Society.

- You will be expected to attend and participate in PAG meetings which are held virtually (on average around 4 per year)
- You will also be expected to represent the PAG at meetings and events, including the SOA Congress and the Annual Members Meeting (AMM)
- You will be expected to read meeting papers in advance of the meeting. PAG members are asked to send apologies if unable to attend a meeting.
- Members who miss more than 3 consecutive meetings without a reasonable cause may be asked to step down.

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Duration of role

PAG members are appointed for a three-year term of office. They can serve a maximum of two terms (six years).

Those representing the PAG on Council will be confirmed at the Annual Members Meeting on 8 December 2025.
