

Role profile: Deputy Chair of the National Rehabilitation Collaborative X 2 Posts

This post is designed to develop the work of the National Rehabilitation Collaborative of the Society and our relationships with leading stakeholders in this area. The Collaborative was established in 2020 as part of our COVID-19 response efforts. Rehabilitation and recovery are priorities for the multi-professional team in critical care and the Society seeks to build a cohesive strategy to progress this work. This includes supporting the NCEPOD study on rehabilitation post critical illness. The post holders will ensure collaborative working with Society's strategic partners, including FICM, UKCCNA and all AHP representative organisations as well as the ICS Professional Advisory Groups.

The post requires vision, expertise in rehabilitation and considerable drive to ensure its success. The Deputy Chair will work closely with the Chair and have the support of the Chairs of the Standards Division and the Professional Affairs Division.

Key responsibilities

1. Supporting the delivery of the Society's objectives for rehabilitation including 6-month, 1 year and 2-year deliverables.

2. Contribute to reports to the Chair of Standards Division summarising deliverables and impact at 6 month and 12 months.

3. Establish and maintain good working relationship with all strategic partners of Council and all those who represent healthcare professionals with an interest or involvement in rehabilitation.

4. Promote the Intensive Care Society and maintain the Society's high profile.

Governance

The Deputy Chairs will work closely with the Chair of the National Rehabilitation Collaborative. The Chair is responsible to the Society via the Chair of the Standards Division who reports to Council and Executive Committee. The post is unremunerated however reasonable expenses will be covered if agreed by the ICS before a claim. This role is for one year in the first instance, subject to review in December 2025 and a further two-year term.
